When we decided to poll construction management influencers, we weren't sure what we'd find. The industry is diverse, with people from all levels and backgrounds contributing each day to make incredible things happen. Our report reflects the insights of these construction industry professionals to help us understand the challenges and trends surrounding general construction management.

As a result of the survey, we gained valuable insight into the emerging industry trends for 2017. We collected data from the survey, cold email campaigns, as well as the NoteVault app, to form conclusions around the state of construction management as we enter the new year.

Throughout this report, you will find multiple statistics and trends to guide your construction management decisions over the next year. For example, one of the most revealing insights was that the biggest industry challenge was daily reporting – with most spending up to 30 minutes to an hour on this task. Overall, safety was reported as the top business priority, followed closely by efficiency, the greatest frustrations being missed deadlines, followed by a lack of transparency and too much paperwork.

Biggest Industry Challenges

What is your biggest daily challenge?

Daily reporting was at the top of the list of biggest industry challenges, followed by deadlines and resource management. Site Managers, Subcontractors and General Managers all listed Daily Reporting as one of their top five industry challenges indicating a growing concern regarding their ability to keep track of critical information, report incidents and review and update construction reports while they are busy in the field. Other top five challenges included procuring new business and staff management.

As a construction business owner, what are you most worried about?

As the construction industry enters 2017, the biggest worry construction business owners face is finding new business followed some way behind by margins and staff issues. Marketing is the least of their worries.

As a general contractor, what is your biggest daily challenge?

When it comes to challenges, resource management significantly lead the way for general contractors who see it as their biggest daily challenge. This is followed by staff management and deadlines, closely followed by daily reporting.



As a site manager, what is your biggest challenge?

Meeting deadlines is the biggest looming problem for time-pressured site managers, followed by health and safety and daily reporting - showing a growing trend with regard to the challenge of getting reports written and submitted.

As a subcontractor, what is your biggest daily challenge?

Subcontractors have similar challenges to site managers. Deadlines and daily reporting came in at first and third place, with the only difference being resource management, in second place.



How long does daily reporting currently take you on average?

Almost 50% of the respondents have found solutions to assist with Daily Reporting and are managing to complete their reporting in 30 minutes. However, over a third of respondents said it took up to an hour of their day, with almost 20% saying it took even longer. Most respondents see it as one of their biggest challenges.



How do you rate your current operations?

The majority of respondents rated their operations as efficient, but many responders reported that their operations are inefficient. One of the most telling results is that no one rated their operations as very efficient, which could be the reason so many respondents are battling to meet their daily deadlines.

On a scale of 1 to 10, with 1 being the worst and 10 being the best, how do you rate your current operations?



How often does your team experience difficulties due to language barriers?

Language does seem to be an occasional barrier to task completion, with the majority of respondents noting that language differences were *sometimes* problematic. This is a challenge that's not easily overcome, as it can significantly slow down the pace of construction projects and impact directly on project profitability.

How often does your team struggle with documents, notes, and photos on the job site?

Almost half of the professionals surveyed said they *sometimes* struggle with these issues, followed closely by respondents reporting they *often* struggled. In the construction industry, it's vital to be efficient in terms of documenting and reporting on the job site. The more time spent here, the less time spent in other important areas affecting revenue and job completion.



Have you had any uninsured claims this year that weren't your fault?

Almost all respondents replied that they had had no uninsured claims that weren't their fault. But what about the 9% of those who did? In the construction industry, claims like these can devastate a project and a solution should be in place to prevent this.



Technology Trends in Construction

There is a growing trend in construction management to embrace technology to assist with efficiency, with more than half the respondents reporting they used mobile apps to manage their construction projects. The majority also feel that they were *highly likely* to adopt smartphone and tablet construction solutions in the next six months.

Are you currently using mobile apps to manage your construction projects?

More than half of the professionals surveyed use mobile apps in their construction projects.

What types of construction projects does your company work on? Check all that apply.

More than 80% of respondents work on commercial projects. Just under half work on industrial and institutional projects followed by just under a third working on heavy civil and residential projects.



What is your likelihood to adopt smartphone and tablet construction solutions in the next 3-6 months? (Unlikely 0-5 highly likely)

43% of the construction industry is willing and likely to adopt smartphone and tablet construction solutions in the near future, showing a very positive attitude towards technology. This enables job sites to increase communication and improve efficiency in their daily operations.

How many technology products are you using for managing your construction projects?

The trend toward adopting technology to improve efficiency is very evident, with the majority of respondents saying they were using between three and five technology products, followed by companies who were using between one and two products. A small percentage of respondents were companies who had really embraced technology, using up to ten technology products on every project.



On a scale of 1 to 10 with 10 being the most skilled and 1 being the least skilled, how skilled with technology is your company?

The results were evenly spread, with the majority ranking their company **very skilled** with technology. This was closely followed by respondents citing **somewhat skilled** and **not skilled** or **unskilled**.

What products are you currently using to manage construction projects? Check all that apply.

NoteVault, software that allows easy voice-to-text citation, increasing productivity and efficiency on job sites, was the most popular product with over a third surveyed using it, followed closely by Autodesk, a form of design, engineering and entertainment software, and PlanGrid, a type of mobile construction management software.



What tasks are you using construction management technology for?

The number one use for construction management technology is project management. Due to the many aspects of project management, such as initiating the project, planning it, executing it, monitoring the process, and closing the project, it makes sense that those in the industry would be using technology to ease the process. By using construction management technology for project management, processes become more efficient and more streamlined.

What are your business priorities? Check all that apply.

Construction management professionals view safety as the top business priority with efficiency as a close second. Safety is an obvious priority to ensure that all employees are kept safe during the construction process. Ensuring that processes both on and off site are efficient is important as it helps to make sure that the entire construction project is kept to budget and is completed on time.



What is your biggest frustration?

Missing deadlines is the biggest frustration for the construction industry. Not only does the entire project become delayed, but this is a huge pain point as it impacts directly on the bottom line.

Along with being reported as the top struggles for *individuals*, daily reporting is also ranked as the top struggle for construction *teams*. It's imperative to have efficient daily reporting, so that time can be better used elsewhere on the project.



How effective is your construction management technology solution(s)?

20% of respondents view their construction management technology solutions as effective, followed by 17% who feel they are very effective. Unfortunately 20% of respondents fell into the group five or lower, indicating there is still opportunity for improvement in this area.

What forms of communication do you use to communicate with team members on the job site?



Phone calls were the most popular form of communication followed by emails and then texting.

Are you currently using voice-to-text note dictation?

Most respondents are **not** using voice-to-text note dictation. The 35% that does utilize the benefits of voice-to-text dictation are able to execute tasks more efficiently and save ample time normally wasted on reporting.



Construction Management in 2017

There is a strong indication that the majority of the industry is seeing the benefits technology is bringing to the construction industry. It is clear though, that the industry still has some way to go before fully embracing the efficiencies technology can bring, particularly when it comes to the biggest pain point of daily reporting. It's important to note that the majority are not using tools like voice-to-text note dictation which could significantly improve efficiencies and help eliminate top pain points like missed deadlines and paperwork.

There is also an underlying problem with managing documents, notes and photos on site, which could also be solved with voice-to-text note dictation. It's interesting to observe that the majority of respondents only rate their construction management technology solutions as effective and that phone calls and emails still rate as the top forms of team communication.
